Conference Objectives

Introduction:

At the global level, the international community recognizes the importance of the role of women in elected structures, especially in parliaments. Enhancement of the role of women in the democratic transition and engaging women in the decision making process is crucial issue for the United Nations based on SCR 1325, which affirms the role of women in the democratic process and political participation. Since the Revolution in 2011, Libyan women participated in the phases of political transition through voting and running for elections. Women gained 16% of the seats in the Elections Law of 2014 as women were elected to the membership of the House of Representatives, they were 31 women out of 200, which is the total number of members.

In spite of the challenges that face women parliamentarians around the world, Hon. members managed to form strong ties with various women and social organizations, which helped support, defend and bring awareness of women issues. Women Hon. members are represented in the different ad hoc committees in the Hon. and they work effectively with their male colleagues. They participated in national and international conferences, which had a positive impact on the promotion of their leadership role.

Since the democratic experience is new, women Hon. members demanded to strengthen their skills in specialized areas so as to increase their institutional parliamentary performance through gaining knowledge about the experiences of women parliamentarians from neighboring states.

Objective of the Conference:

This conference aims to enhance the capacities and skills of women Hon. members through dialogue and consultation with women parliamentarians from neighboring countries, namely Tunisia, Algeria, Egypt, Sudan, Chad and Niger. This is in order to identify lessons learned and exchange views and experiences related to mechanisms for the promotion of the role of women parliamentarians as well as to build bridges and alliances with women parliamentarians in neighboring states.

Participants:

Participants include Hon. members in addition to women parliamentarians from neighboring states. Hon. women members planned for this conference as well as for its different topics and slogans.

Support:

This conference is supported under the umbrella of Amel, a project for providing support to Libyan women during the transitional phase.
