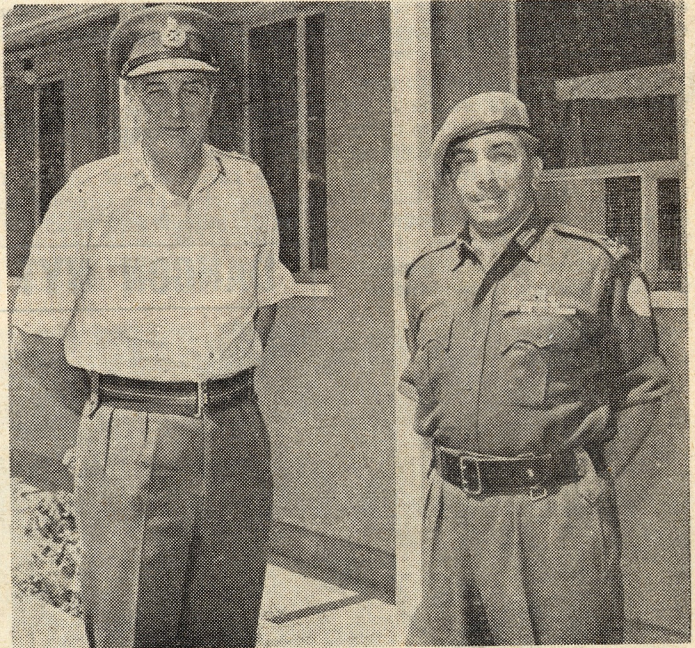

UNITED STATES DONATE 3.000.000 DOLLARS TO UNFICYP

Following is an extract from the text of a note dated 25 March to the Secretary-General, U Thant, from the Permanent Representative of the United States to the United Nations regarding the expenses of the United Nations Peace-Keeping Force in Cyprus (UNFICYP).

"The Representative of the United States is prepared to make a contribution of up to \$ 3,000,000 towards the cost of the United Nations Force in Cyprus for the period December 16, 1969 to June 15, 1970."

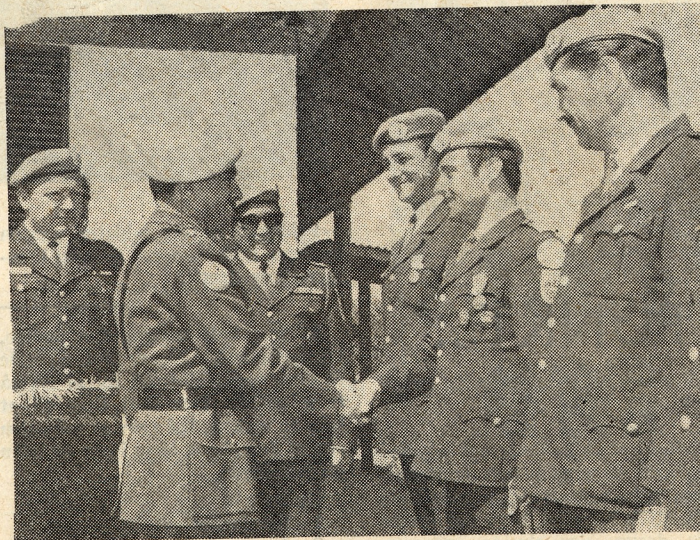
"This pledge raises the cumulative total of the United States pledges to the United Nations Force in Cyprus to 49.1 million."

ROTATION OF IRISH CONTINGENT

The rotation of the Irish Contingent serving with the United Nations Force in Cyprus began on Monday, 30 March 1970, with the arrival of the new Group Commander, Lt Col M.J. O'Brien and his Company Commanders.

The new Contingent, 18th Infantry Group, consisting of 407 all ranks, has replaced the 13th Irish Infantry Group which has been serving first in the Lefka and then in the Kophinou Districts of Cyprus since September 1969. In addition, 11 members of UNFICYP Headquarters staff were also rotated.

The flights, which were by UN chartered aircraft, between Dublin and Nicosia, have taken place on 5, 6, 9 and 10 April.

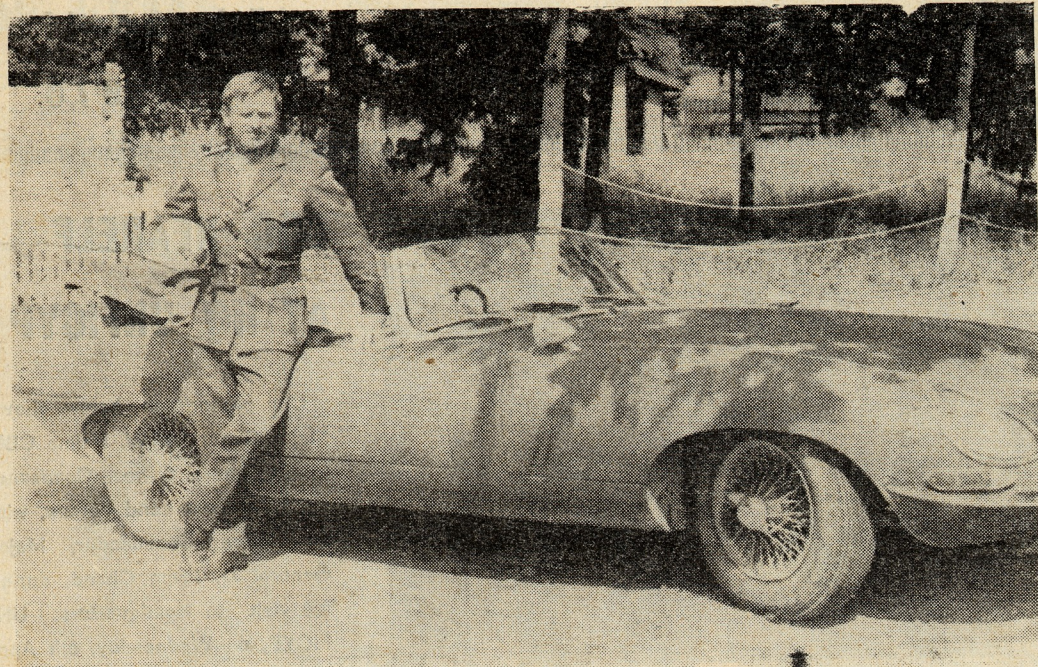
MEDAL PARADE

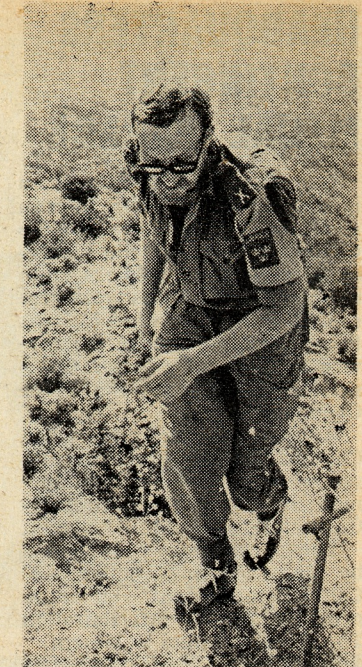

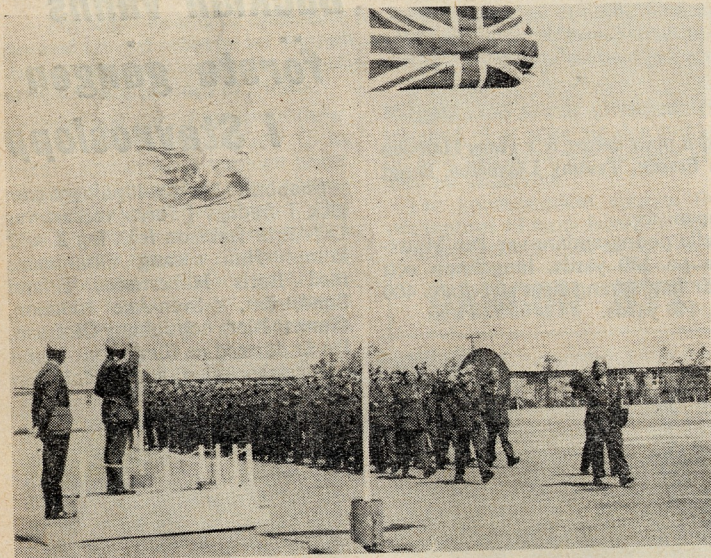

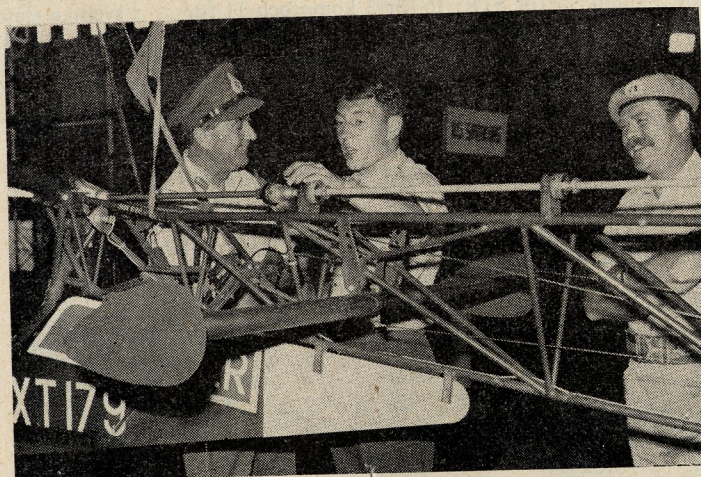

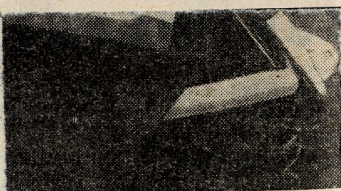

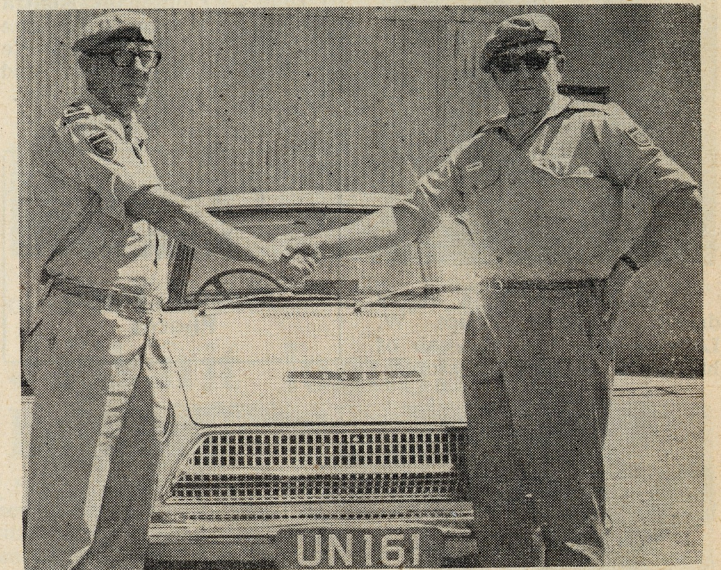
We hope they find their care at home in excellent health and we wish them an enjoyable and restful holiday.

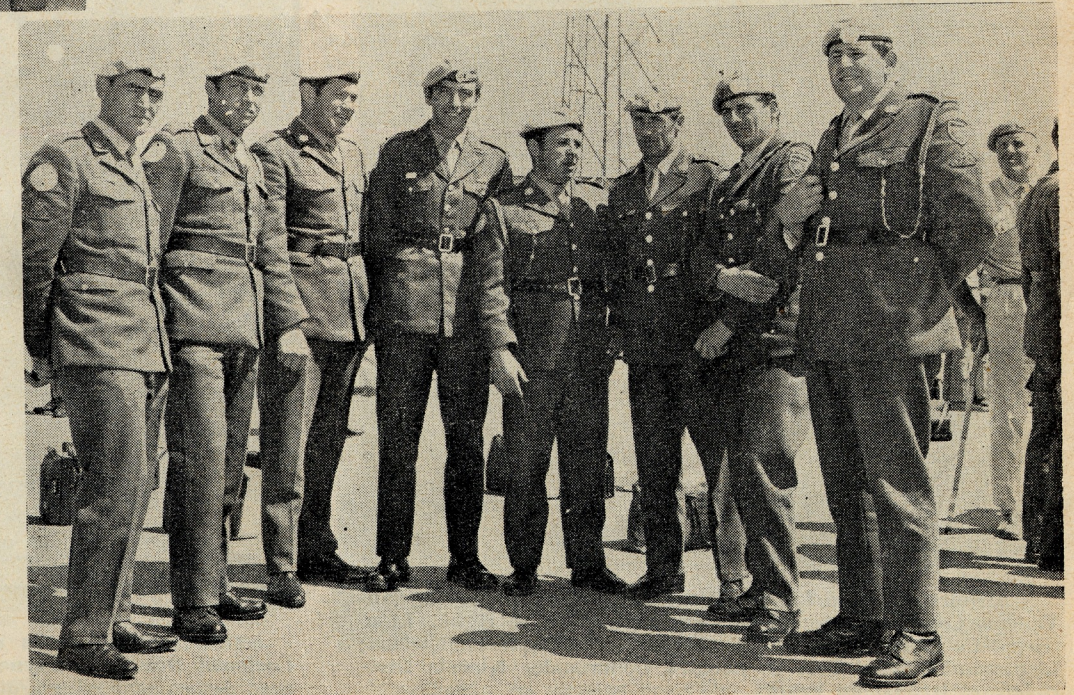

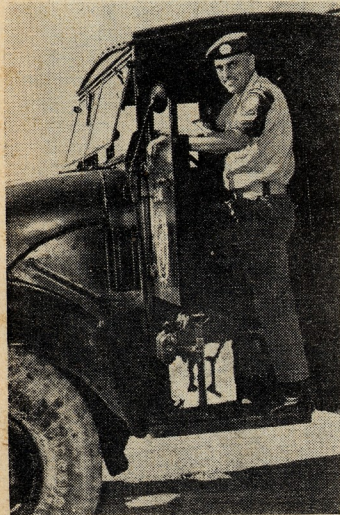

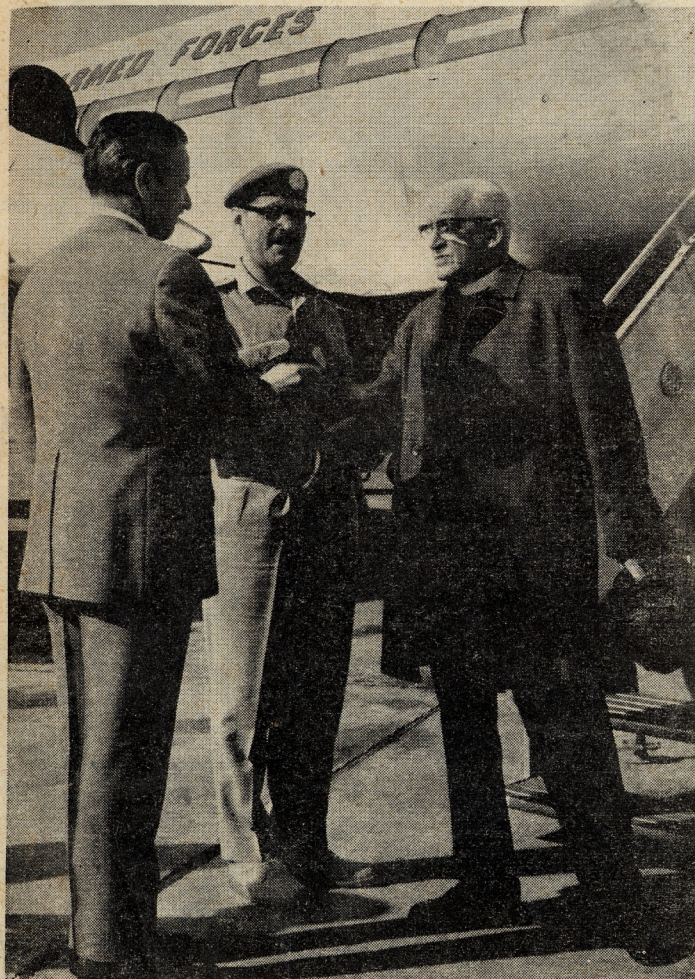
"My men work harder and put in more hours than most in the battalion", Lieutenant Kontra stated, "our only problem is that of man hours".

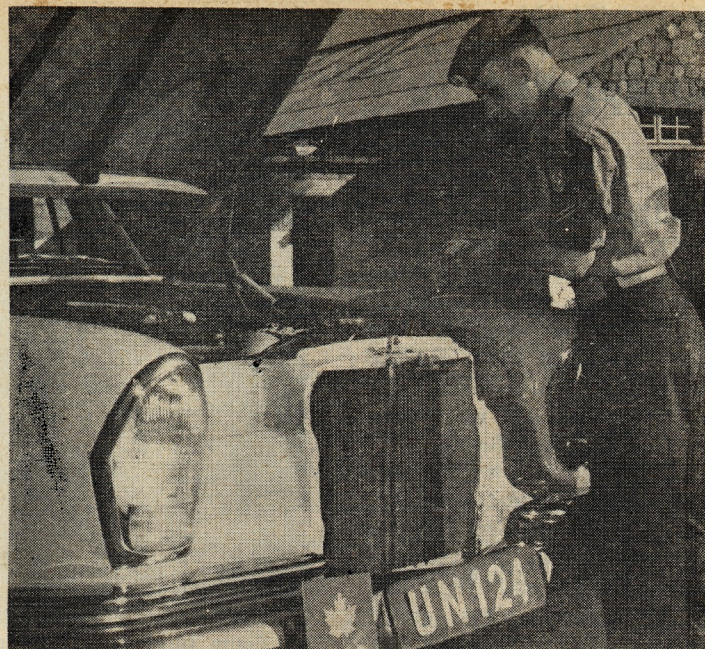

Matkailuun käytetty yli 10 milj mk tällä rotaatiokaudella

Viime syksyyn verrattuna muodostui nyt päättynyt lomakausi vilkkaammaksi. Lomauseerin kapt Rytökön kertoman mukaan viime lomakausi, joka alkoi 23.2. ja päättyi 15.4., oli eräs hänen toimikautensa vilkkaimpia matkailukausia. Kapt Rytökön on hoitanut lomauseerin tehtäviä 26.1.69 alkaen eli pitkälti toista vuotta. Rytökön kotiutuu ensi rotaatiossa.

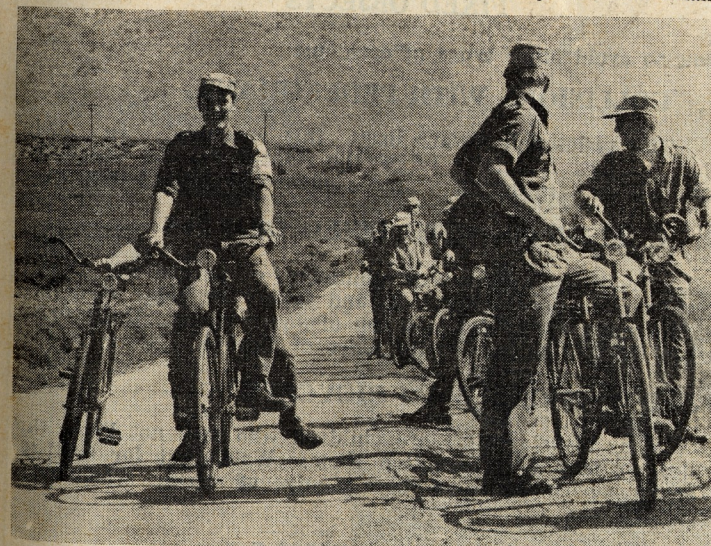
Libanon on ollut ylivoimaisesti suosituin matkailumaa YKSP 12 aikana. Beiruttiin on tehty 11 ryhmämatkaa ja osallistujia on ollut yhteensä 85. Kun otetaan huomioon yhdistetyt Kairo - Beirut matkat, joihin on osallistunut 43 henkeä, on Beirutissa käynyt kaikkiaan 128 henkeä. Enemmänkin olisi ollut Beirutin matkailijoita, mutta siellä sattuneiden levottomuuksien vuoksi Libanon asetettiin matkustuskieltoon 28.3.

Suomalaisia sotilaita on Kyprokselta ulkomaille matkustanut päättyneenä lomakautena kaikkiaan 192. Matkailu on järjestetty pataljoonan toimesta valmismatkoiksi. Matkustaneiden ryhmien suuru-

det ovat vaihdelleet 2 - 20. Matkustuskielto on koskenut Kreikkaa ja Turkia sekä tilapäisesti Libanonia.

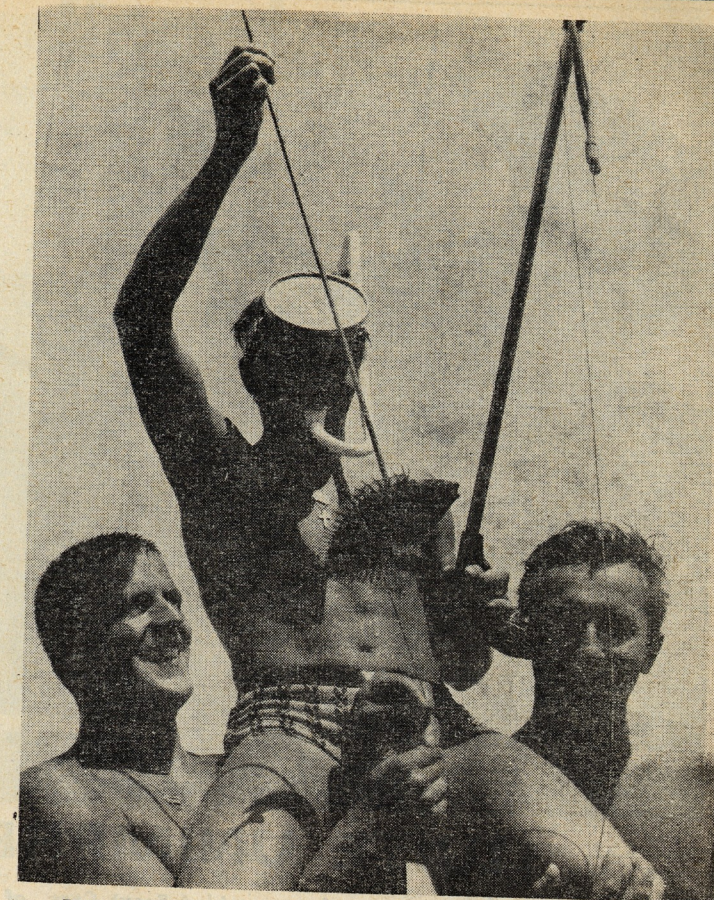
Israeliin on tehty 7 ryhmämatkaa ja matkailijoita on ollut 58. Egyptiin on lähtenyt yksi 16 hengen ryhmä, mutta yhdistettyä Kairo-Beirut matkoja on tehty 3, joihin on osallistunut 43 henkeä. Luxoriin saakka on ulottanut matkansa vain 4 henkeä.

Lentolippuihin ja hotellimaksuihin ulkomaille on käytetty rahaa tällä rotaatiokaudella noin £ 5.000. Voidaan arvioida, että palveluspaudestaan ulkomailta nauttineet 192 sotilasta ovat käyttäneet muihin maksuihin ja ostoksiin ainakin

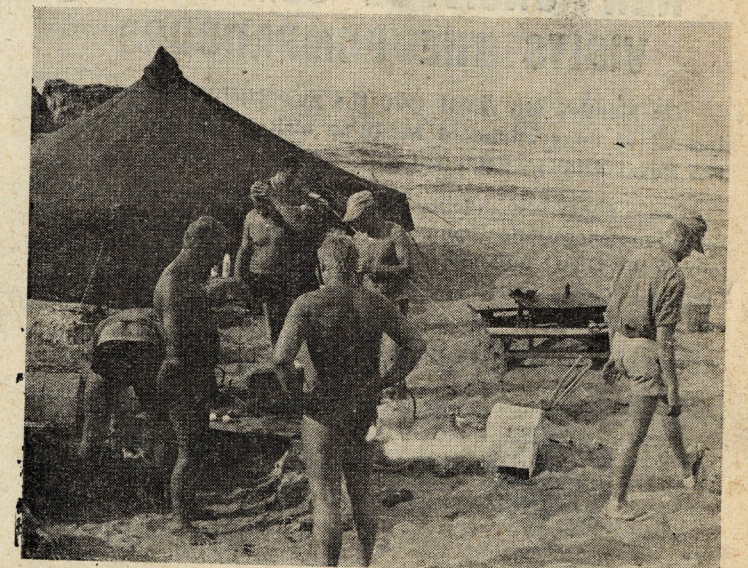
Jääkärit lomailivat kotoisella beachillään

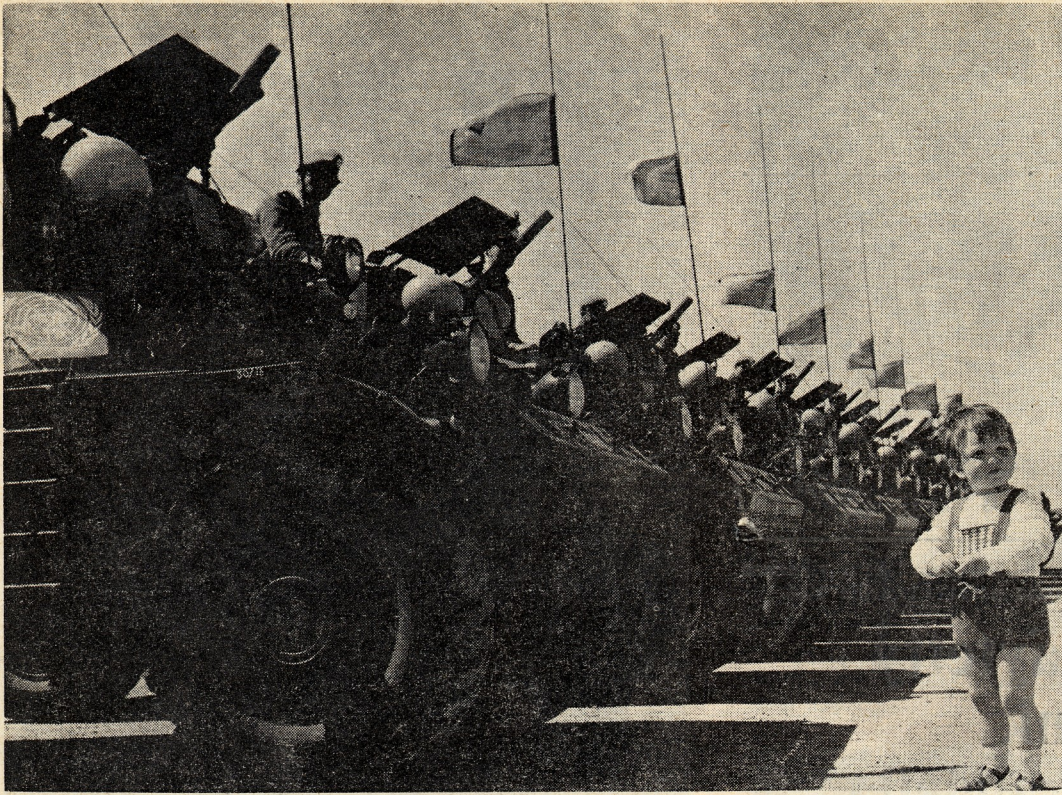
kymmenkunta miestä on viettänyt yönsä beach'illä.

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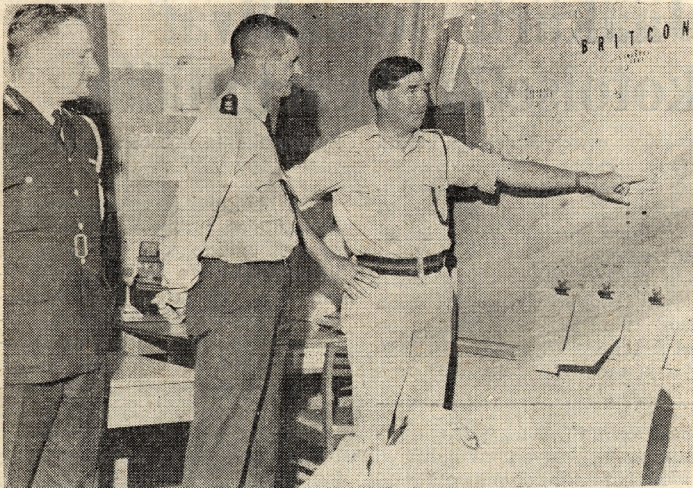
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NEW UNCIVPOL COMMANDER VISITS THE POMPADOURS

"COLLISIONS WITH FIXED OBJECTS"

How to avoid other types of accidents:

1. COLLISIONS WITH PEDESTRIANS

The pedestrian always loses this encounter. To avoid this, the best rule is to forget the right-of-way, let the pedestrian have it rather than take a chance on hitting him.

2. COLLISIONS WITH FIXED OBJECTS

A collision with a wall, abutment, or parked car usually results from poor judgement, and failure to judge clearance at the sides, front back and top of your vehicle. Don't drive when tired or under the influence of alcohol.

3. COLLISIONS WITH BICYCLES

Many bicycle riders are children who may not know the rules, or may have forgotten them. Watch out for cyclists. Tap your horn, and give them plenty of room when you overtake.

4. COLLISIONS WITH ANIMALS

Proceed with caution in farm country or in open land where livestock may cross the road. Slow down until you have passed the animal, since it may suddenly dart into your path.
