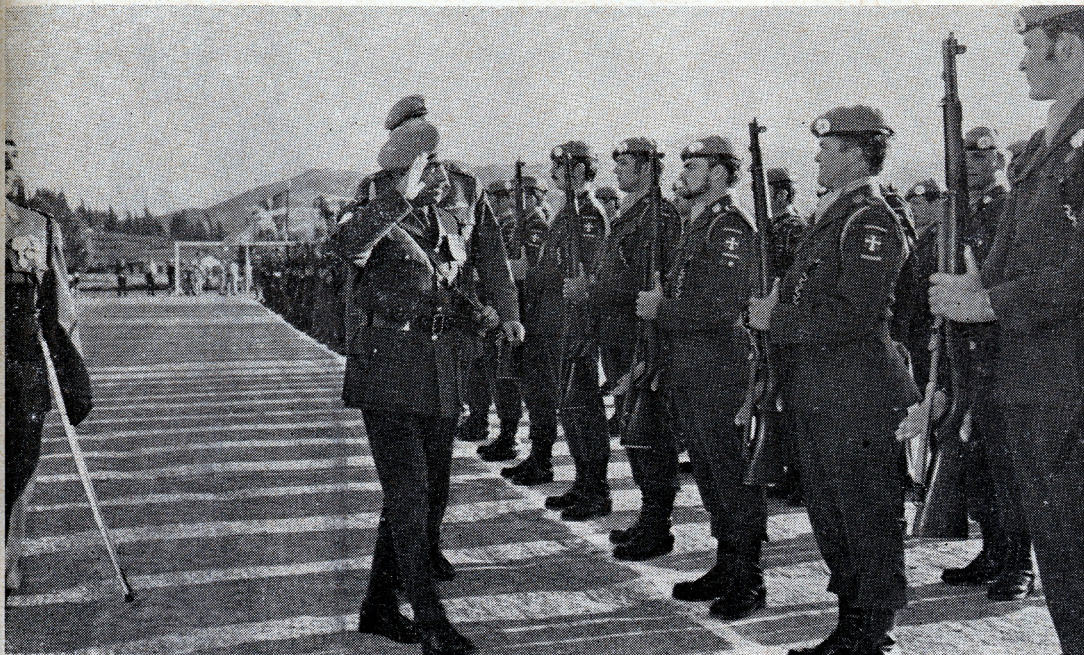

## DANISH MEDAL PARADE

A large crowd of spectators last Thursday witnessed the Danish Medal Parade at the sportsground in Xeros, which coincided with the official celebration of the birthday of His Majesty King Frederik.

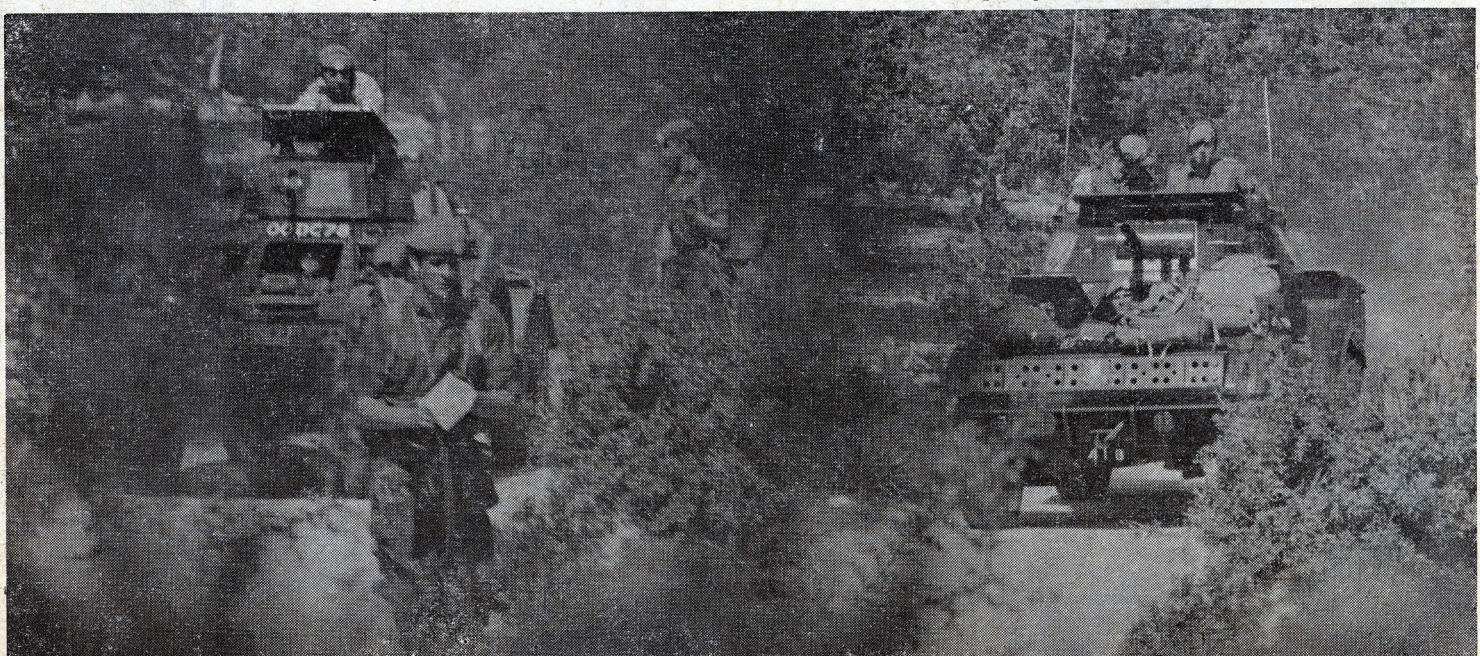
## MULTINATIONAL EXERCISE

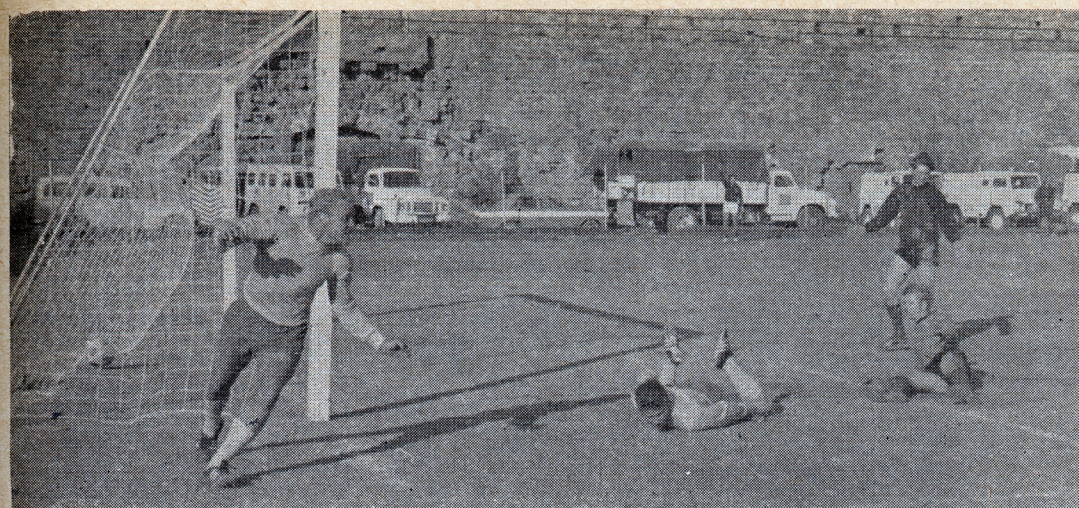
## DANCON NYT

## Anglo - Swedish Attack

## MEDAL PARADE FOR 'A' COY

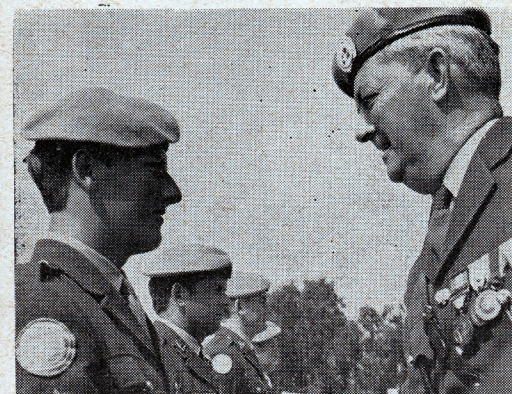

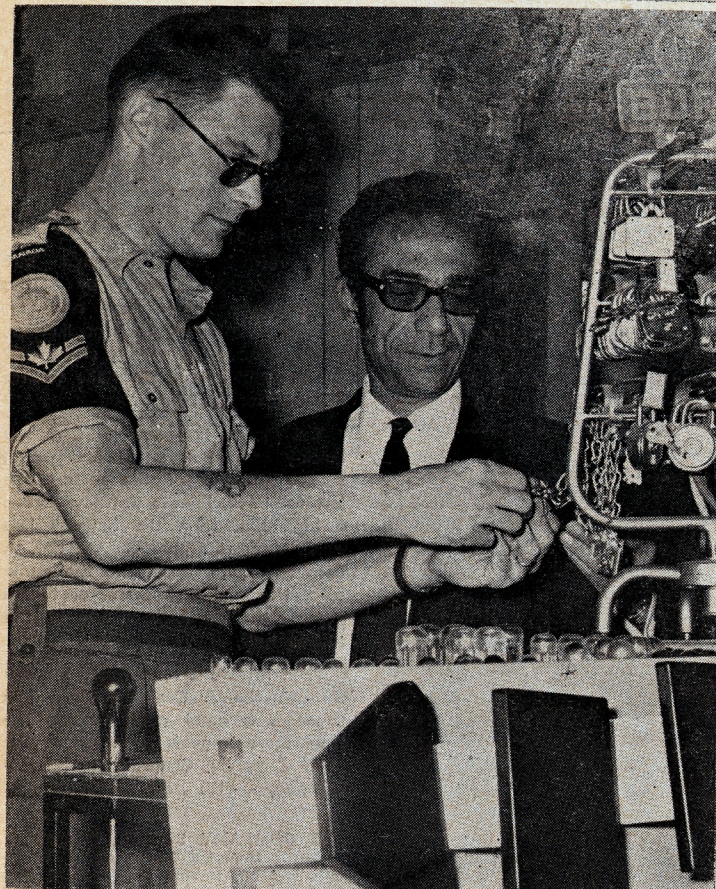

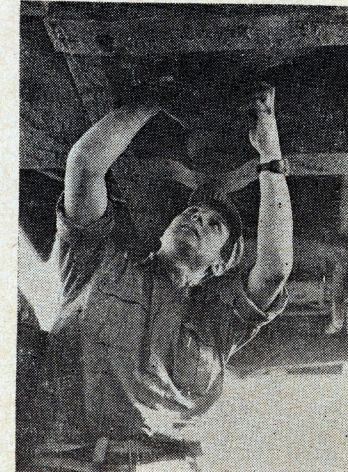
