

CARNIVAL

Rain splashed the empty narrow streets of Kyrenia as tiny brightly costumed figures huddled excitedly in the temporary shelter of crowded doorways. It was carnival time, and there was nothing that could dampen the enthusiasm of the local children.

Like the stage that it was, and right at curtain time, the sheet of rain was drawn back to reveal the sun and the actors spilled out into the streets.

The town came alive to the prancing, marching music of the Corps of Drums of the 3rd Regiment PPCLI from Nicosia as they led the excited children through the streets down along the Mediterranean shore to the traditional party in the Dome Hotel. Then, like the well timed play that it seemed



to be, as the last tiny figure entered the building, a torrential curtain fell from the darkening sky and the streets were empty once again.



VISIT TO AUSTRIAN POLICE

Last week the Force Commander visited the Austrian Civilian Police detachment at their new headquarters location in Nicosia. The picture shows the General accompanied by Major W Beier, the Contingent Commander, as he inspected the detachment on parade.

The Austrian Police are proud of their safe driving record. In 1970 they covered 455,944 miles in Cyprus without being responsible for one traffic accident. Only four drivers were involved in accidents and in none of the cases did the blame lie with them.



PARTIAL TURKISH ROTATION

The relief of part of the Turkish National Contingent took place on Friday, 26th February. Units of UNFICYP were heavily committed throughout the day providing inland transportation, escorts and observers.

46 officers, 24 NCOs and 281 other ranks, together with their personal baggage and Battalion Stores arrived on the Turkish ship T.C.G. Erkin and were escorted to the Turkish National Contingent area at Orta Keuy. The outgoing party, consisting of 46 officers, 22 NCOs and 279 other ranks, were repatriated on the same ship.

UNFICYP observer teams

supervised the disembarkation and embarkation operations at Famagusta Docks.

OFF THE BEATEN TRACK













SKILL AT ARMS

SWIMMERS IN TRAINING





Aid For Pakistan

Last week, a cheque for £400 for the East Pakistan flood victims was handed to Mr. Osorio-Tafall, the Special Representative of the Secretary-General, during a ceremony at the Pancyprian Gymnasium in Nicosia.

The cheque, the result of a collection among secondary school pupils, was presented to Mr. Osorio-Tafall by Stalou Yallouridou, head of the school's UNESCO Club. Also present at the ceremony was Mr. C. Kyrianiou, Principal of the school, and Mr. C. Psilopoulos, President of the Federation of UNESCO Clubs in Cyprus.

Mr. Osorio-Tafall later handed the cheque to the Pakistan High Commissioner, Mr. Rashid Ahmad, who was visiting Cyprus from his Beirut office.

AWARD TO CIVILIAN MECHANIC

Last year, Mr. Ibrahim Hashmet, a vehicle mechanic in UNFICYP Workshop REME, was granted the maximum local award by the Officer Commanding, of £3, for his design for a special tool which considerably reduced the overhaul time for 27½ KVA generators. These are used for power and lighting at Kokkinia and Limnitis. This design has now been assessed by the Ministry of Defence in London, as a result of which, he has been awarded an additional £7.
