

RE-SUPPLY BY HELICOPTERS



We deeply regret having to report the death of Major Flemming Rye Hansen, 40, of the Danish UN Battalion Dancon XIII, who was killed as the result of a traffic accident on the Nicosia-Morphou Road just South of Morphou on 2nd September.

Major Rye Hansen was travelling as a passenger in a private car driven by another Danish Officer who was slightly injured.

Major Hansen, who was married, with three children, came from Slagelse, Denmark. He had been in Cyprus since May, 1970.

A memorial service was held at the General Hospital, Nicosia, on Saturday 5th September.



MINDEHØFTIDELIGHED FOR MAJOR F. RYE HANSEN



Forcecommander, general D. Prem Chand, deltog sammen med Dancons officerer og repræsentanter for alle personel-grupper og for Dancivpol.



Ogaverne art og mængde kan ikke klart defineres og afgrænses, men de løses løbende af den rutinerede chef og hans veluddannede mandskab.







HEADQUARTERS UNFICYP ORDNANCE DETACHMENT









ROSE OF TRALEE AT ZYYI



DISTINGUISHED VISITOR


Colonel R. Poirier, Command Chaplain (RC) from Mobile Command Headquarters, is visiting the Canadian Contingent this week.






IT'S STARTING AGAIN





efficient way in which the events took place.


The contestants gave an appreciative audience an entertaining afternoons display and there was plenty of excitement with the final team

result in doubt right up to the last minute. The team from HQ UNFICYP and Force Reserve were the eventual winners with a one point lead over Swedcon.


Individual honours must go
